



Data Protection – Parent Consent Form

I understand that Delph Primary School needs to use and store some essential information about my child.

I understand that the school holds the majority of its data on a mandatory basis (as required by law), and some which is voluntarily provided by the family. This information includes personal information such as name, address, date of birth, medical conditions, attendance information etc., which helps the school to support pupil learning and well-being.

I understand that information provided to the school will be securely recorded and handled in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulation 2018.

I understand that where it is legally required, or necessary (and it complies with data protection law) the school may share personal information about pupils and families with external agencies, as detailed in the school's Privacy Notices including: the Department for Education; Local Authorities; schools that children move to after leaving us; health and social care organisations.

I understand that the school shares pupils' data with the Department for Education (DfE) on a statutory basis. This data sharing underpins school funding and the school has a legal obligation to provide test and assessment information data.

I understand that the school will not share information about pupils with any third party without consent, unless the law and our policies allow us to do so.
